NEW STUDENT CHECKLIST



We look forward to welcoming you to campus soon! Prior to your arrival, please make sure you've taken care of all the items listed below. This checklist is also accessible on our website at www.post.edu/orientation.

- Speak with your admissions representative to select a registration day so you can register for classes.
- Finalize your financial aid package by signing and accepting your award.
- Send all final official transcripts (AP/college credits) to Office of Main Campus Admissions.
- Complete and send in your health forms no later than **August 1, 2017**.
- Waive the university's health insurance plan if you already have insurance that complies with federal requirements. This must be done by **September 29, 2017** or the cost of the university insurance plan will be automatically added to your student account.

FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS

May I bring my car to campus?

Yes! All students may have cars on campus.

I'm a commuter student. Is there a place where I can hang out between classes on campus?

Yes, we have a Commuter Lounge located right in the middle of all the action in North Hall, and our main student lounge in the Leever Student Center, The Eagle's Nest, is open to all students with a selection of games to play and a regular schedule of student activities.

If I already have health insurance, can I decline the university's insurance plan?

Yes. All students are required to have valid health insurance. If you wish to rely on your own valid insurance policy instead of the University plan, you must waive your participation in this program by September 29, 2017. If you do not waive coverage by September 29, 2017, you will remain in, and be billed for, the Post University student insurance plan for the entire policy year.
