This information reflects the completion or graduation rates and transfer-out rates for those full-time, first-time degree/certificate seeking undergraduate students who began their degree program in Fall 2016 and completed within 150% of normal time. This information is disaggregated by gender, race and ethnicity (as defined by the National Center for Education Statistics' IPEDS surveys), and by recipients of a Federal Pell Grant, Federal subsidized Stafford Loan who did not receive a Pell Grant, and by recipients of neither a Federal Pell Grant nor a Federal subsidized Stafford Loan.

The annual rates are based on the 12-month period that ended August 31 of the prior year. These rates track the outcomes for students for whom 150% of the normal time for completion or graduation has elapsed. Normal time is the amount of time necessary for a student to complete all requirements for a degree or certificate according to Post University's catalog. This is typically four years for a bachelor's degree in a standard term-based institution, two years for an associate degree in a standard term-based institution, and the various scheduled times for certificate programs.
