Post University has recently received your request to place your loans in deferment status. A deferment is a period during which repayment of the *principal* and interest on the subsidized portion of your loan is temporarily delayed.

## Instructions

When completing your in-school deferment form it's important to fill out the correct sections in order to ensure that the proper loans are deferred while you're attending school.

## 1. Fill out the following sections:

- a. Section 1 list your most recent identification information
- b. Section 2 check off whether you are going to be attending full-time or half-time status
- c. Section 3 make your deferment official by signing and dating the form
- d. Section 8 identify whom you'd like the deferment sent to by including your Servicer's mailing address and fax number.
