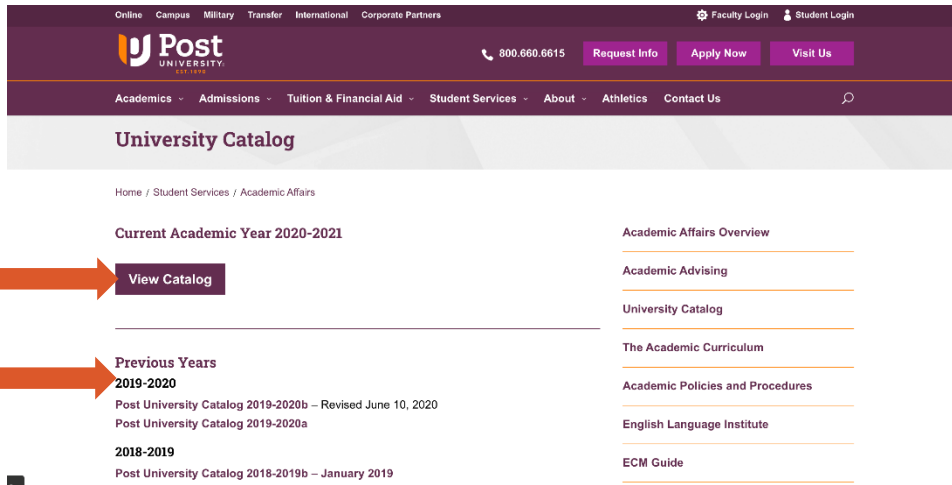


# University Catalog Guide

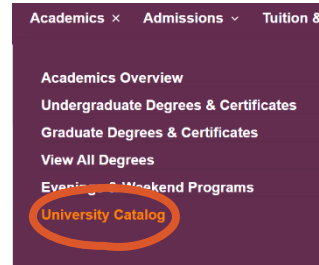
## Accessing the Catalog

1. Go directly to **Post.edu/catalog**.
2. Click the **View Catalog** button to open the current catalog. PDFs of previous catalogs are available below the button.

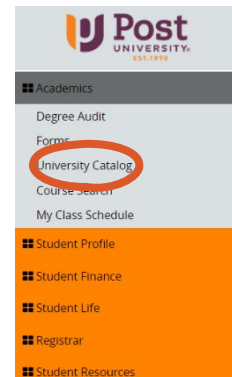


You can also access the University Catalog using these other options:

- On Post.edu, go to the **Academics** tab in the top menu, and then select **University Catalog** in the dropdown.



- On Student Portal, expand the **Academics** section in the side menu, and select **University Catalog**.



## Navigating the Catalog

You can navigate to programs, courses, and other pages by using the **Section Links** on the right side of the catalog.

## Tools

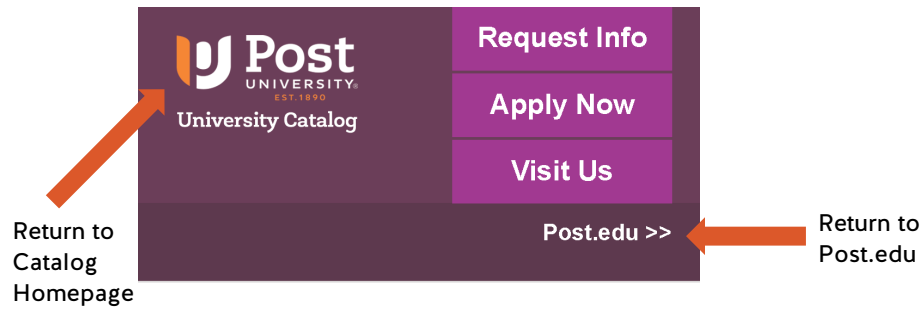
At the top of each page, you will see a combination of the following tools:

-  **Print Degree Planner**

-  **Share**

-  **Help**
