DNP - EDUCATIONAL LEADERSHIP SPECIALIZATION

This specialization offers educational opportunities to build the skills needed to create and deliver innovative models of teaching and learning. It also covers leadership and management skills nurses could find useful in academic programs.

DNP - EXECUTIVE LEADERSHIP SPECIALIZATION

DNP - PROFESSIONAL LEADERSHIP SPECIALIZATION

This specialization covers five key competencies-leadership, business intelligence, finance, health policy, and health services research-while providing curriculum flexibility for a more personalized education.

This flexible track allows students to customize their degree to fit their unique career goals. Students choose seven courses to meet their individual objectives.

ADMISSIONS REQUIREMENTS

- The DNP program is open to nurse managers and educators who hold a master's degree, a BSN, and an unencumbered RN license.
- > A bridge program is available to those who have a master's in a field other than nursing and want to earn a DNP with Executive Leadership or Informatics Leadership Specializations.
- > Students pursuing the DNP with Educational Leadership or Professional Leadership Specializations must hold an MSN.
- > Students entering the DNP Informatics Leadership Specialization must show a minimum of one year full-time work experience in an informatics nursing leadership role during the last five years.

REQUIRED COURSES

- > Health Services Research

- > Advanced Statistics
- > DNP Capstone II
- > Strategic Leadership and Planning
- > Two elective courses*

*Students in the professional leadership track do not have set specialized courses and will complete seven elective courses.
