RN TO BSN PROGRAM

The RN to BSN program is designed to help registered nurses pursue the skills needed to make a difference for patients as well as their own futures in nursing. The program is offered through two learning modalities: Term Based and SIMPath® (Competency Based).

Term Based:

- > Structured eight-week terms
- > Consistent assignment due dates
- > Weekly instructor interactions
- > Take 1 or 2 courses at a time

SIMPath®:

- > 16-week semesters
- > Self-paced format
- > Complete as many courses as you can during the 16-week semesters*

***Start with two courses. Add in more as your schedule allows. You can register for additional courses up to the 13th week. Unfinished courses will need to be repeated.**

CREDIT TRANSFER POLICY

RN TO BSN/MSN PROGRAM

The RN to BSN/MSN program is designed to give registered nurses an opportunity to earn an MSN degree and be awarded a BSN along the way. You will complete fewer courses than students who earn these degrees separately, saving you time and money. The RN to BSN/MSN is available in both learning modalities: Term Based and SIMPath®.
